Little Bilingual Readers

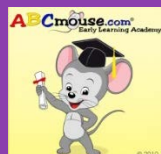
Tuesdays, November 6 & 13 from 11:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m.

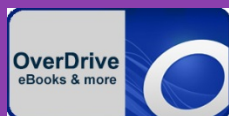
